TOP ATTRACTIONS AROUND MOSHI

Mount Kilimanjaro

Materuni Waterfalls & Coffee Experience



Located in a lush Chagga village, Materuni offers scenic hikes through tropical greenery leading to a beautiful waterfall. Visitors can also enjoy a traditional coffee-making tour with local hosts.

Chemka Hot Springs (Kikuletwa Hot Springs)



A natural geothermal oasis surrounded by fig trees and crystal-clear turquoise water. Ideal for swimming, relaxing, and enjoying a peaceful nature escape.

TPC Sugarcane Plantation

Tarangire National Park



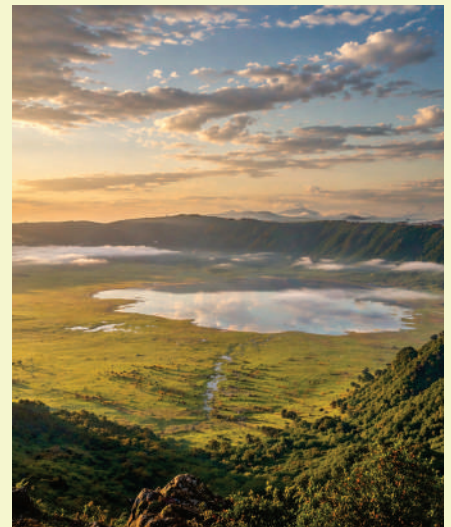
Famous for its large elephant populations and ancient baobab trees. The Tarangire River attracts wildlife year-round, especially during the dry season.

A compact but diverse park known for tree-climbing lions, flamingos, groundwater forests, and scenic views along the Rift Valley escarpment.

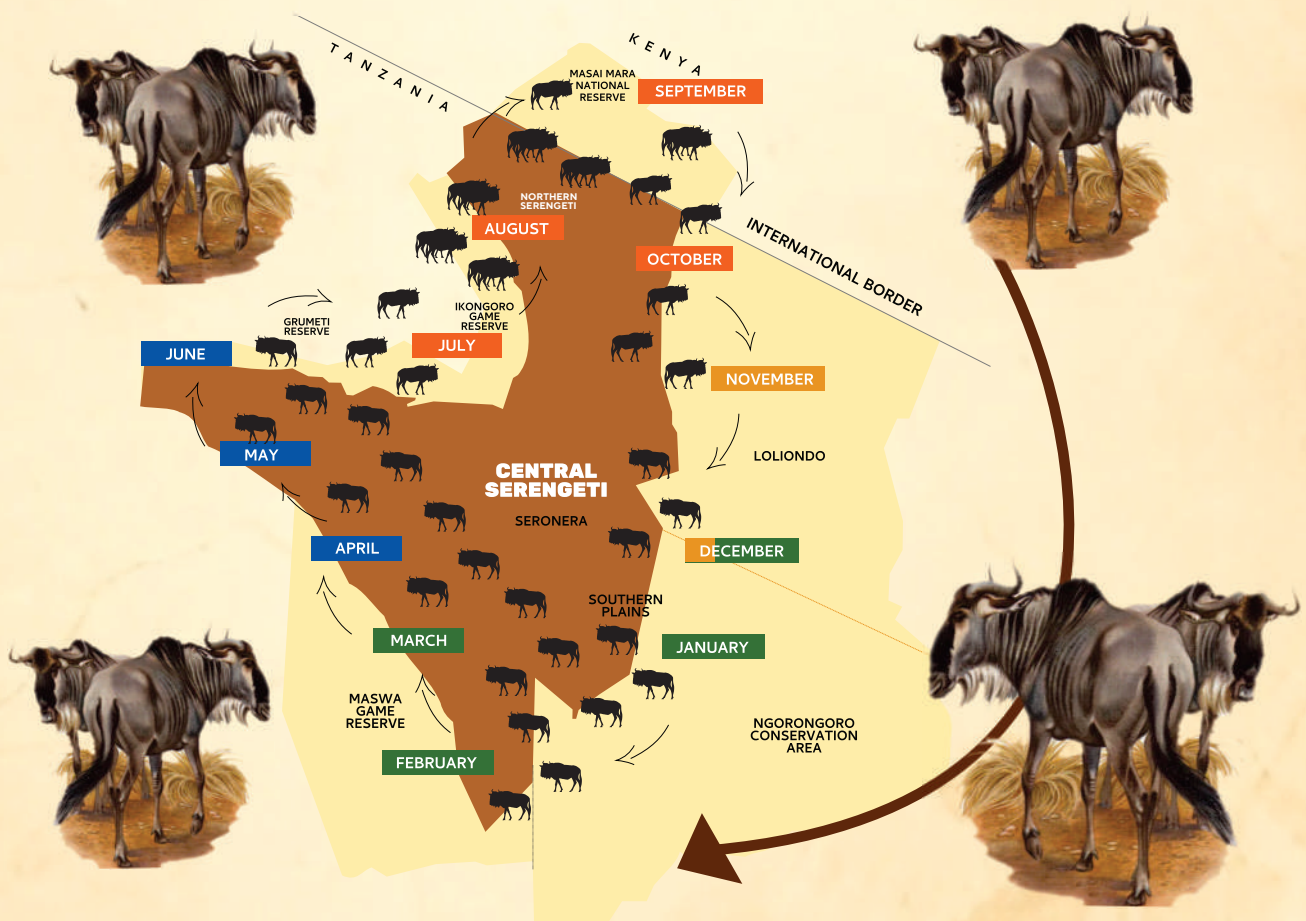
Ngorongoro Crater

THE GREAT WILDEBEEST MIGRATION

The Great Wildebeest Migration is one of Africa's most spectacular wildlife events, where over two million wildebeest, zebras, and gazelles move across the Serengeti National Park in search of fresh grazing and water. Visitors can witness calving seasons, dramatic river crossings, and vast moving herds



- Green Season – Calving, exclusive lodges, dramatic predator scenes
- Serengeti Passage – Scenic movement & fewer crowds
- Premium Safari Season – Legendary river crossings, peak wildlife density
- Golden Return – Clear skies, photographic plains, herds regrouping
